In partnership with **Lake County**, the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) will open a Local Assistance Center (LAC) at the **Youth Services Center on Monday, September 16.**

LACs are activated following disasters to support survivors and businesses suffering disaster-related losses or damages. Each center is locally operated with support from state agencies, federal partners, and non-profit organizations.

State Agencies:

California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV): Can assist with replacing lost or destroyed driver's license

California Employment Development Department (EDD): Can assist with disaster unemployment due to impacts from the fires

California Department of Public Health (CDPH): Can assist with attaining vital documents and public health information

California Franchise Tax Board (FTB): Can assist with disaster tax information

California Department of Insurance (CDI): Can assist with attaining vital documents and assist with insurance claims

Contractors State License Board (CSLB): Can provide a list of authorized contractors who are verified to assist with rebuilding

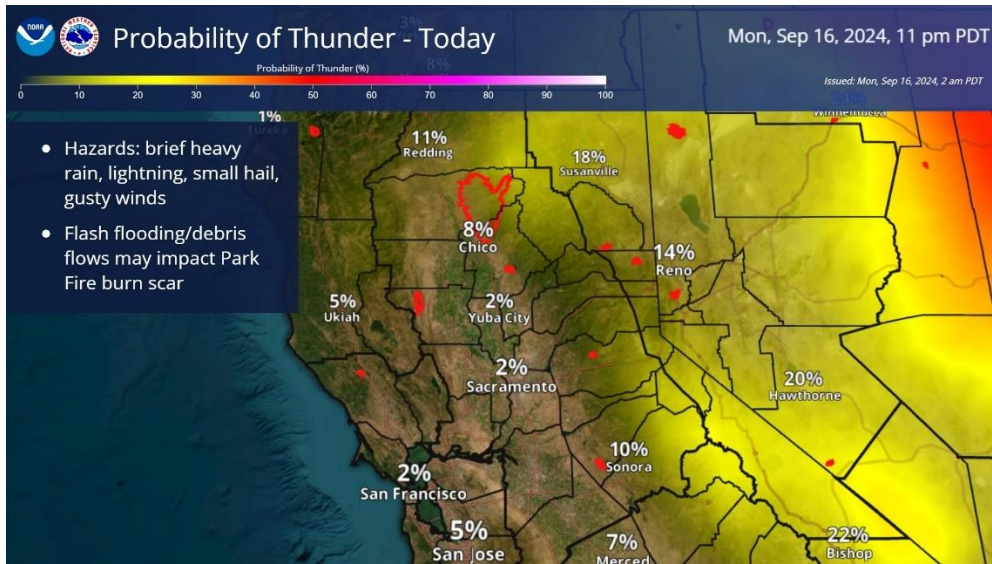

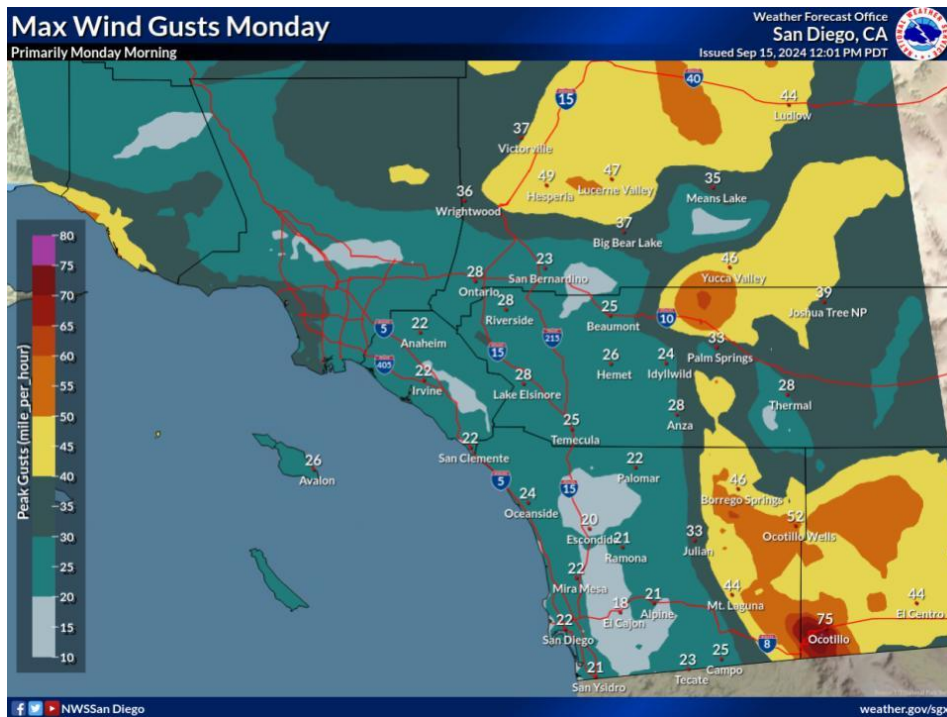

Daily Focus – Weather Update

NWS Sacramento – Scatter showers and isolated thunderstorms expected later this afternoon and evening with best chances over the Sierra. When thunder roars, go indoors!



NWS San Diego – Areas of gusty southwest to west winds, strongest for the mountains and deserts for this afternoon and evening with gusts of 35 to 45 mph with gusts in the northern Coachella Valley below the San Gorgonio Pass of 60 to 70 mph.



Actions Taken by the State and Federal Government

September 11 - As the state continues to mobilize personnel and resources in the ongoing response to Southern California wildfires, Governor Gavin Newsom traveled to Southern California and proclaimed a state of emergency in Los Angeles and San Bernardino counties in response to the Bridge Fire and in Orange and Riverside counties in response to the Airport Fire.

September 11 - Governor Gavin Newsom announced that California has secured a Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG) from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to help ensure the availability of vital resources to Riverside County to assist with the costs of suppressing the Airport Fire.

September 10 - Governor Gavin Newsom announced that California has secured a Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG) from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to help ensure the availability of vital resources to Los Angeles and San Bernardino counties to suppress the Bridge Fire.

September 9 - Governor Gavin Newsom announced that the California National Guard will support the state's ongoing response to the Line Fire in San Bernardino County.

September 8 - Governor Gavin Newsom announced that California has secured a Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG) from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to help ensure the availability of vital resources to suppress the Boyles Fire in Lake County.

September 7 - Moving quickly to support the state's response to the Line Fire, Governor Gavin Newsom proclaimed a state of emergency in San Bernardino County and announced that California has secured a Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG) from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)

September 6 – Governor Gavin Newsom ended the drought state of emergency in 19 counties where conditions have improved significantly, and maintained it in the remaining 39 counties to address continued impacts to local water supplies and facilitate ongoing recovery. Additional action rolls back certain provisions of prior drought- and flood-related executive orders that are no longer necessary under current conditions.
