SUBJECT: EMERGENCY TELEPHONE USERS SURCHARGE RATE FOR YEAR 2022

Dear Ms. Sherrod:

As stipulated by Revenue and Taxation Code Sections 41030 and 41031, the Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) shall determine no later than October 1st annually, a surcharge rate that will produce sufficient revenues to fund the expenditures authorized in support of California's 9-1-1 program. The authorized expenditures and calculations are summarized in Table 1.

Cal OES recommends the State Emergency Telephone Number Account (SETNA) surcharge be maintained at 30 cents (\$0.30) for calendar year 2022.
